LIFESAVING MANAGER'S REPORT

2021/22 has been another successful season. As we emerged tentatively from the pandemic and opened up, our wonderful team of volunteers ensured a safe and happy season for all visiting patrons. This season was longer than normal due to patrolling requirements from LSV extending to Anzac Day weekend. Patrolling numbers were strong for the season with new BM holders and a fresh crop of SRC's joining our established patrolling members. This season saw us extend our patrolling groups to five with Anthony Dixon stepping up to the role of Patrol Captain, joining Helen Finnigan, Sami Zehir, Danny Van Engelen and Adam McCosh. As a club we completed a total of 3019 patrol hours, which is a credit to each and every one of you who turned up during the season. We also received a snap audit from LSV during the season. Our crew passed with flying colours receiving 1000 points out of 1000.

Our stats for the season were:

• Patrolling Members: 108

• Patrol Hours: 3,019

Beach Attendance: 13,907Preventative actions: 156

Minor 1st Aids: 15

This season also saw our second Pink Patrol. Pink Patrol seeks to celebrate and highlight the contribution to our Club by all our female members, to promote gender equality, to increase the number of women on patrol, to provide positive role models for future generations and to create an environment that encourages networking and positive, supportive relationships.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Patrol Captains – Danny Van Engelen, Helen Finnigan, Adam McCosh, Anthony Dixon and Sami Zehir as well as Assistant Captains Shaun Murrihy, Dean Dwyer, Bob Beekhof and Scott Hetherington for their tireless work throughout the season.

Valuable training opportunities with Marine Rescue popped up again this season including the Moyneyana Ocean Swim and training with the Air Ambulance.

Pete Artis again oversaw the maintenance and running of the IRBs. Pete is an extremely knowledgeable and proactive member in ensuring our most valuable lifesaving assets are in working order at all times. Pete also took on the role of Maintenance Officer within the club.





Ted Phillips took on the role of OH&S officer this year. Ted brings a wealth of knowledge to the role and continues to advise us on our OH&S obligations. Leonie Boyd & Rachael MacMahon continued to ensure our radios are maintained to a high professional standard. Helen Finnigan continued again this year as First Aid Officer. Helen ensured our first aid room and supplies met LSV's high level of standard.

Our Rescue Equipment Officers were Dean Dwyer & Danny Van Engelen. Dean and Danny maintained our patrol rescue equipment throughout the year, ensuring that all our equipment is fit for purpose and ready for use as and when needed. They also procured 6 additional rescue boards and an additional Defib for the start of next season.

Scotty Hetherington is our Emergency Management Coordinator. Scott maintains our Emergency Callout team and keeps them fighting fit and ready for action at very short notice. Our call out crew have attended several incidents over the last year, including the rescue of a 400kg turtle trapped in netting off Killarney. We are hopeful that training opportunities continue to present themselves in the off season for the call out team with Marine Rescue, Victoria Police and Ambulance Victoria.

Martina Murrihy has continued as Patrol Manager, producing and maintaining our patrol groups and rosters. This is no simple task. The entire recording process was changed this past season with very little notice or support. Registering hours and managing patrol lists will continue to be streamlined in future with electronic recording and we continue to look for ways to improve. Thank you again for supporting me with these arduous tasks.

To Steve Watty, our Honorary Medical Officer, thanks for agreeing to be there as an important resource for our Club.

To our Life Saving Committee - Pete, Dean, Martina, Ted, Leonie, Rachael, Danny, Steve & Scotty, thank you for all you do in the pivotal roles you fill and in making this Club what it is. Your professionalism and commitment make it a pleasure to be involved with Port Fairy SLSC. Hopefully you will all put your hands up again next season and we can all continue to take our Club to new heights.







NIPPER COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Our Nippers season was once again a success, with East Beach filled with nipper boards, volunteers, rescue boards, rescue tubes and smiles from ear to ear as the nippers learned & practiced their surf skills in the water and on the sand.

Planning for the season started very early in August 2021 with on-line meetings and collaboration between LSV and all the Victorian Surf Life Saving Clubs, to overcome the COVID unknowns. After many months of preparation our COVIDSafe Nipper Program commenced on 12th December, 2021 and concluded on 27th February 2022, with 13 sessions in total. Our Nippers totalled 399 across the various age groups, which was amazing considering the uncertain circumstances we were facing yet again.

We were blessed with perfect conditions for our sessions which contributed to the large numbers of enthusiastic youngsters taking part. East Beach was again a sea of pink, green and orange as our Nippers were joined by great numbers of both qualified and trainee water safety personnel.

Our Program

Throughout the season, our team of age managers, water safety and other volunteers ran 13 Nippers sessions. These sessions covered all of the prescribed theory and practical sessions required under the LSV Nippers program including;

- Basic first aid skills, including a CPR demonstration and hands-on practice
- Identifying rips and different types of waves
- Understanding the hazards on our beach
- Sun safety
- Signals
- Learning about lifesaving patrols
- Tour of club rooms

Most importantly, we also had the fun activities on the beach and in the water (which the Nippers all love) -

- Board paddling technique and races
- Swims short and long
- Ironman / Ironwoman events (individual swim/run/board event)
- Aqua Cameron events (team events including wade/board/swim/run legs)
- Beach flags
- Beach sprints and relays
- Long beach runs

A special thanks must go to our Nipper Age Managers for their dedicated and energetic approach to our program. For those first timers who stood up when everyone else wouldn't, high five to you. For the old timers who have retained their enthusiasm and improved their skills each year, thanks to you too. I hope we can rely on many of you next season to both support and guide the kids but also to mentor the new volunteers as they come through.


